A breakfast is held on the 3rd Sunday of each month during the winter (at the Thunderbird Diner on Hammonds Plain, Halifax). Their holiday party was on January 12th. The first run for 2019 will be held on May 5th, from Bedford to Peggy's Cove to Bridgewater. Twelve members plan on attending the Bar Harbor gathering on May 30-June 2. Saturday, July 20th – Show and shine from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. in same parking area as last year; Corvette RC race cars with a track for Corvette owners only at \$5/10 laps (money for charity). Another custom designed trophy for the show and shine's 16 categories. Evening boat cruise at 7 p.m. ending with the fireworks display on the water. The cost will be \$25/person with the balance being paid by Hines Marine. Register in the morning with the Seasfest organizers before registering with the CCNS.

Sunday, July 21st – Show and shine continues, 10 a.m. – 3 p.m., Seafest awards given out at 2 p.m.
