
This is pretty close to the design of the new 2012 Corvette and maybe a split window in rear of the coupe.

As most of you know 9 Corvettes from the Maritimes attended Corvettes at Carlisle. 7 from our club and one each from PEICC and GMCC. We left on August 25 at 9:00 am from the Salisbury Irving. We did pretty good, arriving at our motel Travelodge Sturbridge at 7:30 before it got dark. The motel was great, we have used this motel since 2005 and this year we even had security. A company has bought 20 rooms and provides security at night for their vehicles and the other guests. As a welcome surprise the Cadillac club was also staying over night.

The next day we were held up with construction and we only went about 10 miles in an hour and a half. The only slight problem of the day was our 80 developed a small hole in the radiator. It holds almost 4 gallons so I was not worried, we just drove it to Carlisle, and when we got there I put solder seal in the radiator and fixed the problem.

We arrived 5 minutes late for registration. We looked around a bit and then we went to Advance Auto so we could pick up the parts, oil sending unit and air conditioning compressor (air compressor in NS is almost \$400 down there \$150) we ordered before leaving home.



The press critics loved the way the 1953 and 1954 Corvettes performed, but initial customer responses fell flat. Officials early on had hoped to build 10,000 two-seaters at St. Louis in 1954, actual production amounted to about a third of that.
