Already planning next year – talking with Rodd's and sampling trophies.



Vettefest 2019, Prince Edward Island

The following are the details for Vettefest 2019 which will take place in PEI on Saturday and Sunday August 17th and 18th. The first day is the Island Tour and the second is the Show Day.

Dates are in the heart of the high tourism season in PEI. We suggest that, if you have not already booked your accommodations, you should do it soon. The following is how the weekend will unfold:

ISLAND TOUR DAY

The Island Tour will start at 10 AM at the parking lot adjacent to Gateway Village on the PEI side of the Confederation Bridge. This is the same meeting place as in past years. We will spend the day touring rural and small-community PEI. This year will see us focusing on parts of western PEI which we have not done for a few years now.

We will be stopping for lunch around noon at the Stompin Tom Centre at 14024 Rte 14 COB 2B0 near Tignish. After lunch we will continue the tour which should end around 3 PM or so. Our Club members will be available to help to get everyone to their hotels/motels.

The free BBQ will be held beginning at 6PM. There will be a Chinese auction after the BBQ. As in the past we would welcome any auction items from participants. The location of the BBQ/Auction is the Jack Blanchard Family Centre (which is adjacent to the Holy Redeemer Church) located at 7 Pond Street in Charlottetown. This is the same location as in 2018.

SHOW DAY

On Sunday the Show will be held at Action Car and Truck Accessories in Charlottetown. This is the same site as in 2018 and is located at the corner of the TCH (also known as Capital Drive) and the Lower Malpeque Road/North River Road. Registration is from 9 AM to Noon and the show will run from Noon until 3:00 PM. We will also have our Free Shuttle service available to take participants to and from the show site to restaurants and shopping areas.

As has been the case with other ACCC shows recently, Vettefest will not include participant voting by class this year. This will be replaced by additional prizes to be drawn for during the weekend.

11 Key Facts about the mid-engine Stingray (more details and stats to come in your next newsletter – stay tuned)

- New V8 with 495 horsepower: The entry-level C8 Corvette will make 490 horsepower and 465 pound-feet of torque from the new, 6.2-liter LT2 V8. That's 35 more than the current Corvette Stingray, and if you opt for the performance exhaust, output increases to 495 hp and 470 lh-ft
- No more automatic: For the first time, the Corvette will be offered exclusively with an eight-speed, dual-clutch transmission.
- **0-to-60 in less than 3 seconds:** Thanks to that motor and transmission, the entry-level Corvette with the Z51 package will sprint to 60 miles per hour in less than 3 seconds.
- **Driver sits 16.5 inches further forward:** Putting the engine in the middle helps handling, but also moves the driver forward, creating a "race car-like view" out the front windscreen, according to Chevrolet.
- Interior was inspired by jet fighters: The new Corvette is going supercar hunting, and to help that, the interior was inspired by modern jet fighters. Chevrolet specifically name-drops the F-22 and F-35.
- The roof still comes off
- Room for two golf bags
- **GPS-enabled suspension lift:** That nose may be shorter than on the current Corvette, but it's still liable to find the ground on steep driveways and the like. The 2020 Corvette can raise its schnoz by 40 millimeters and can save up to 1,000 locations where it'll automatically lift.
- Right-hand drive will be available: For the first time, the Corvette will be available with the steering wheel on the right side for UK and Asian markets.
- **Production begins later this year:** The lines start running in late 2019 down in Bowling Green, Kentucky, so best get those orders in if you want to be first on the block with one of these.
- Priced below \$60,000: We won't have final, official pricing for a while, but General Motors president Mark Reuss did say the C8 Corvette will start below \$60,000, making it one heck of a bargain.
