Car Care Tips for that Trip of a Lifetime

.

As most of you know Debbie and I and 20 other Corvettes are leaving in about a week going on the Corvette Trip of a lifetime, Corvettes @ Carlisle, Bowling Green, a big car show in W.V. and a 3 day Corvette Show in Lake George, N.Y. With the idea of putting on around 8500 kms in 3 weeks, a few things should be looked at to hopefully make for a better trip and less problems. A lot of this should also be looked at for any long distance run, even a weekend trip.

Any vibrations should be taken care of as they can drive you crazy on a long trip. Take a good look at your tires, you could have a broken belt or need to be rebalanced . It may be or a bent rim or if your tires are wearing uneven you might want to have an alignment done. Don't forget that with a C4 or older Corvette, especially if you have a weak spring, weight makes a big difference in the rear camber. So I would fill my gas tank to give it some weight and then get it aligned. If you get it done with your tank on empty and most of the time on vacation or even on day trips you have a full tank and or luggage, this will make a difference in the alignment. I always take a couple of pounds of air out of each tire before heading South as the higher road temperatures will increase your tire pressure. Always change your oil & filter and grease the car before going on a big run and check all fluid levels including the rear end. Make sure your belt(s) and hoses are in good shape and tight and have extra with you as nobody stocks hoses and belts anymore and could help save hours on the side of the road. Make sure your travelling buddy has spare key for your car so you do not get locked out.

It is important to have your passport as you need one to drive across the border and make sure you have medical insurance, which you can get at a travel agent, as medical issues in the USA is a very costly adventure. Make sure you have all your paper work in good order showing your Corvette is licensed, inspected and insured. Also make sure you have your confirmation numbers with you for the motels.

You might want to have your air conditioning working as Carlisle and Bowling Green can be very hot.

You also need a frs/gmrs radio to keep in touch with everybody while travelling and the Corvette Caravan going to Bowling Green uses the radios to inform everybody of problems/gas stops or whatever. They also come in very handy in Carlisle as there is 82 acres of Corvettes (6000 usually attend) and parts and it would be very difficult to find somebody. We will probably use channel 5.5 in Carlisle as using a solid channel like 5 is in use too much.

We like to use a CB radio in long cruises and they are pretty cheap to buy. For around \$60.00 you can buy a CB and a glass mount antenna for \$30.00 or less. They usually can be heard at longer distances.

If you have a repair manual on your Corvette it might be a good idea to have it along in case you have problems.

We leave on August 26 and get back on September 15th, hope to see you soon.
