Ron Fellows Corvette Performance Driving School, Nevada, USA

This article might sound like a plug for Ron Fellows Corvette Performance Driving School, and I guess in one sense it is, but it is based on my experience of attending their Corvette driving school this past January. First of all, did you know that if you purchase a new Corvette that GM significantly subsidizes the cost of this 2 day driving school? I did not. I only found out by accident since my dealership did not tell me. The regular cost of the school, including 2 nights' accommodation at the track, is approximately \$4000. GM offers up the school for \$1000 and covers 1 night accommodation for a total cost of \$1150. That's a savings somewhere north of \$2800!

The school is based out of the Spring Mountain Motor Resort, a 332 acre resort 1 hour west of Las Vegas, Nevada. It boasts having the longest road course in North America at 6.1 miles and is configurable to about 75 different tracks. For our particular training we used a 1.5 mile road course setup (highlighted in the picture) along

with other non-track sections of the resort for skid pad and other training. The Ron Fellows School is top notch and professional in every respect. We had an amazing ratio of 6 instructors for 12 students and they provided us with an exact match (model and transmission) of our own personal Corvette. My car was a Z06 automatic, the blue #85A in the pictures, which was dedicated for my sole use during the training. Program your seat and mirror settings and you're good for the 2 days.

Each day ran 8am to 4pm with a consistent format of classroom learning followed by driving, more classroom then driving, i.e. learn the theory then go and practise. Day 1 was predominantly training on a large expanse of asphalt including serpentine, wet figure 8's, straight drag strip acceleration with emergency braking for the 180° turn, dry rectangle pylon course and more, many with an instructor in the passenger seat to assist. Suspension mode was always set to "track" with traction and stability controls turned off. You were encouraged to push the car in this controlled environment with instructor comments like "Where else are you going to be able to aggressively find the boundaries of your Z06's traction?" I did, with a couple of unexpected 360's. At the end of some of these sessions the instructor would activate the traction/ stability controls just to experience the difference. I can now say that I will never drive the Corvette in the rain without first setting the mode to "weather", it worked that well on the wet course!

Then came the track sessions, one at the end of day 1 and all of day 2. They continued in the same format... classroom/ driving, but on the track it was 1 instructor and 3 cars. The instructor was never a passenger in your car. Instead they drove a lead car which had a rear view camera and screen to observe your driving and a transmitter to the student car radio to constantly provide feedback. Braking points, hitting the apex of the turn, applying gas, etc. was constantly communicated as well as all of your errors. It was very impressive how they could see everything and yet maintain speed. While not surprising, it turns out I had no clue about the fastest way around a corner. Understanding the workings of the Corvette limited slip differential (locking and unlocking) and finding the apex of a corner were particularly helpful during the classroom sessions.

And then before you could blink, the school was over. Another day of track training would have been fantastic but maybe that wouldn't have been enough either as the



adrenaline addiction built quickly. I can say that that my skill level grew with each and every session and I now feel much more comfortable managing the Z's 650 ponies in all aspects of driving. So a big two thumbs up to the Ron Fellows Corvette Performance Driving School for a job well done. If you purchase a new Corvette in the future I highly recommend utilizing GM's subsidy offer (C8 sessions have already started). You won't be disappointed. I'm smiling just thinking about it.
